## Notes from the Editor: Confederate Memorial Day

The Sentinel would like to thank all Compatriots in Secession Camp that attended the various Confederate Memorial Day ceremonies last month. Your presence at these functions sends a strong message out to all of those that doubt our resolve to always show pride in our Confederate heritage. The sacrifices made by these brave men of the South should never be considered as less important than the sacrifices made by all American soldiers, whether Union or Confederate. We are the descendants of some of the greatest fighting men in the annals of history. I take great pride in knowing that the same blood that ran through the veins of my Confederate ancestor, also runs in my veins and those of my son. The same blood that was also spilled in defense of his family, home and country resides in all of us as descendants of these great men. Like most Compatriots in our Camp, my Confederate ancestor died during the war. I had a Great Grandfather die in Point Lookout from disease after being captured at Pickett's Charge while fighting with the 37th NC Infantry, Co. G. He also lost his brother, same regiment and Company, early in the War at Frayser's Farm during the Seven Days Battle. Many of us can look into our family histories and see where Fathers, brothers, Uncles and cousins went to fight for the South and many did not come home. Their commitment was true and their sacrifices great. I feel this quote exemplifies our resolve to honor our heritage then and now.

"If I ever disown, repudiate, or apologize for the Cause for which Lee fought and Jackson died, let the lightnings of Heaven rend me, and the scorn of all good men and true women be my portion. Sun, Moon, Stars, all fall on me when I cease to love the Confederacy. 'Tis the cause, not the fate of the Cause, that is glorious!"

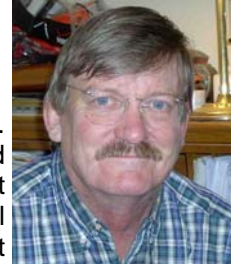

**JUNE SAW LAST CONFEDERATE GENERAL SURRENDER**

Stand Watie was born in the Cherokee Nation on 12 December 1806 near what is now Rome, Georgia. When the Federal Government pushed for the Cherokees to remove to Oklahoma in the 1830s, Watie was one of the few to agree. He signed the 1835 treaty in which the Cherokees gave up their eastern lands and moved to Oklahoma and Arkansas – what is called "The Trail of Tears". In Oklahoma Watie became a successful planter.

When the War Between the States began, the Indian Territory [Oklahoma] was split on whether to support the United States, which had broken almost every treaty with them, or join the Confederacy, States of which had forced their removal west. Although the Cherokees officially remained "neutral", after the Confederate victory at Wilson's Creek, Watie raised a Cherokee volunteer regiment called the Cherokee Mounted Rifles and was appointed colonel by the Confederate Government. Watie and his troops pulled daring cavalry raids throughout Indian Territory against both Union troops and pro-Union Indians. Striking quickly and hard, Watie became known for his genius at guerrilla-style warfare. By 1864 he and his troops controlled most of Indian Territory, driving pro-Union Indians north into Kansas. On 6 May 1864 he became a brigadier general, the only Indian to reach general status during The War.

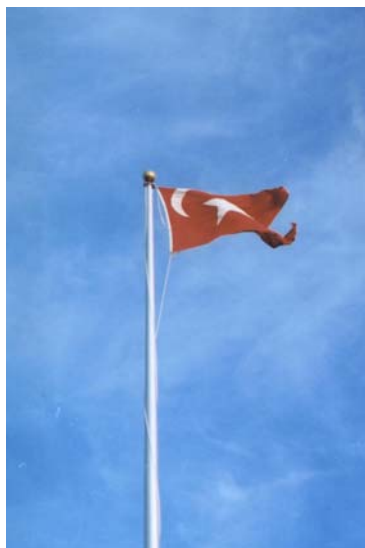
Watie was one of the few generals to ever capture a boat. The Yankees sent the steamer *J. R. Williams* from Fort Smith up the Arkansas River to resupply Fort Blunt. Guarding the \$120,000 worth of supplies on board were 26 Union soldiers. Watie and his troops opened fire on the steamer with artillery and rifles, forcing it to beach across the river. The Yankees fled back to Fort Smith, leaving the boat and the supplies to Watie.

When Richmond fell, and Lee and Johnston surrendered, Watie was unwilling to admit defeat. He kept his command in the field for nearly a month after Gen. E. Kirby Smith surrendered the Trans-Mississippi on 26 May 1865. His command was one-third of the Cherokee Nation and they had been proscribed by the tribe for refusing to repudiate the treaty made with Richmond. He later received a message that Union Lt. Col. Asa C. Matthews had been appointed to negotiate a peace with the Indians. On June 23 Watie rode into Doaksville near Fort Towson in Indian Territory and surrendered his command of Creek, Seminole, Cherokee, and Osage Indians.

The last Confederate general officer to surrender his command, Watie lived his remaining life varying between poverty and meagre success, dying at Delaware City, Oklahoma, 9 September 1871.

He served three years in the Army which included a tour in Vietnam. He has written several books including one about Wade Hampton: Confederate Warrior, Conservative Statesman. At the beginning of the War, Hampton organized his own unit, which was known as Hampton's Legion. His unit contained over 1,000 men which he outfit at his expense. Following the death of J.E.B. Stuart, Hampton took over as Commander of the Confederate Cavalry.
- Treasurers Report - Buck Perry was not present to give a report.
- Committee Reports: Mickey Davis was given by Woody Weatherford. A deposit of \$115.00 was made from the April meal. A commitment of \$495.00 to sponsor a child to attend the Sam Davis Youth Camp has been authorized. The current balance is \$1,698.08. Chaplains Report: Sy reported that Joe Davis who lives in North Carolina has cancer and is receiving treatment. Fred Tetor is recovering from surgery and doing well. He also thanked those who attended the services at Magnolia Cemetery and at the French Huguenot Church. Michael Dixon reported that the next highway cleanup will be on May 31. Louie Warmoth was not in attendance due to illness but turned in \$1,091.00 which was made from the yard sale. Those who helped were asked to stand. Bryan Riddle was not present to report on the Heritage Ride which will take place on Saturday, September 27<sup>th</sup>. 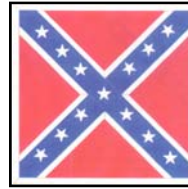

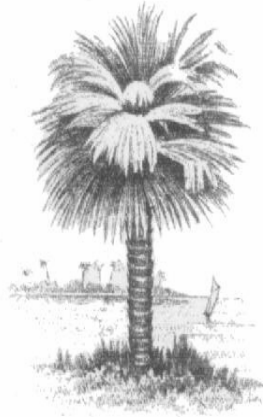
